

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS

### TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about November 20, 2020, St. Johns County will submit a request to the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (PL 93-383), to undertake a project known as Countywide Housing Rehabilitation. The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate substandard homes owned by low to moderate income citizens residing throughout the unincorporated areas of St. Johns County and the City of St. Augustine Beach. The amount of CDBG funding for this project will be \$323,798.

The housing rehabilitation activities proposed are categorically excluded under HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58 from National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for this project are available for public review. ### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the St. Johns County's Housing & Community Services Division, at the address stated above, or by emailing them to: [housing@sjcfcl.us](mailto:housing@sjcfcl.us). All comments received by November 20, 2020 will be considered by St. Johns County staff prior to submitting a Request for Release of Funds to HUD.

### ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

St. Johns County certifies to HUD that Michael Wanchick, in his capacity as County Administrator, consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the St. Johns County to use Program funds.

### OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and St. Johns County's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of St. Johns County; (b) St. Johns County has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to Thomas Bilodeau, Program Manager, Community Planning and Development, U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD), 400 West Bay Street, Suite 1015, Jacksonville, FL 32202. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
